## **Reading and Writing Workshops**


This year all students across the school will be engaging in Workshop Models during literacy and math's learning. The Workshop Model was implemented last year and will continue to be implemented for the following years. The Reading and Writing Workshop Model was developed by an Educator named Debbie Miller. Debbie Miller is a teacher, author, and literacy consultant. She taught in the Denver Public Schools for thirty years and now works extensively with schools and districts on long-range planning and development of literacy programs. Workshop Models allow for explicit reading and writing strategies to be taught, independent work time for students to practices, with one on one or small group conferencing with teacher, followed by a reflection to conclude the Workshop. The school has invested in 'Book Boxes' for every student to be used in Reading Workshops. The 'Book Boxes' allow students to store texts that have been selected by the teacher and themselves. This gives them autonomy in their reading choices that then allows for higher engagement in reading. Ask you children what books they have in their 'Book Boxes' now.

## Preschool

The Bilbies and Koalas have had an excellent start to the year and settled into the school quickly. The children have been exploring a range of inside investigations, including play dough, sorting shapes and colours, magnetic tiles and button hunting at the rice table. The construction room has become a quick favourite, with children building long train tracks that span the whole room.











Outside, children have been getting familiar with the space, building a river on hot days; they loved watching the water run down the sand and begin to fill the bed. They added lots of rocks, sticks and various other materials to change how the water flowed. Children also enjoyed taking trips in the car, climbing on the A-frames, and playing the floor is lava on the steppingstones.









Finally, children started looking at the weather they learnt about the different kinds of weather and the indigenous names in Ngunnawal language for sun, rain, wind, and clouds. After their learning, children had the choice to create a weather scene.













## Kindergarten

Kindergarten students have had a fantastic start to the year and all students have settled into the new learning environment. The learning focus for the first weeks of school has been establishing daily routines, making new friends, exploring new outdoor play spaces, and learning about behaviour

expectations.









Across all year levels of Theodore Primary, the morning session is focussed on literacy. Kindy students have been reading the book 'Smarty Pants', by Joy Cowley and learning about the letter sounds S, A and P. A highlight for students has been learning to be *Word Detectives*. This is an activity that has been incorporated into our Home Reading Bags, please ask your child to share this with you!

In the middle session, the learning focus is numeracy. The students have been learning about number 0-10 and practicing making representations of these numbers.









After break 2, Kindy students participate in a fine motor program. The aim of the learning is to build the small muscle groups in students' hands. Strength in these muscle groups supports students across a range of learning activities at school, such as maintaining a grasp on a pencil and opening and closing scissors.

## Mid Week Lunchbox Favourite Suggestion

## Egg and Avocado Sandwich

### Prep 5 mins

#### Ingredients

- · 2 slices wholegrain bread
- ½ cup baby spinach leaves
- 1 egg, hard boiled and de-shelled
- 2 tbs avocado
- 1 tbs low-fat natural or Greek yoghurt
- ¼ tsp Dijon mustard
- ½ tbs lemon juice

#### Method

In a small bowl, mash together egg and avocado. Add yoghurt, mustard and lemon juice and mix well. Spread mixture evenly over one slice of bread, layer over spinach leaves and top with remaining slice.

#### What is Saver Plus?
