Principal's report

Lockdown Update

As I am writing this report, the information from our Chief Minister and the ACT Education Directorate is that there will be an announcement on Tuesday 31st about whether the lockdown in ACT will be extended or not. It seems likely that we will continue with some form of remote learning until the end of term 3.

Remote Learning

Our teachers are reporting significantly better engagement from the students in remote learning this time as compared to remote learning in 2019. They have large numbers of students checking in each day and the majority of students are completing the learning tasks set for them by their teachers. Students are expected to check in each day by either attending a Google Meet (Years 3-6) or completing a check-in task on SeeSaw each day (Pre- Year 2). By checking in this way teachers can mark the roll to indicate that students are in attendance with flexible learning. We are still seeing a small number of children of essential workers attend school. They are being supervised to engage in the remote learning tasks and Google Meets set up by their class teachers.

We have a daily roster of staff who are able and feel comfortable to come into school with on-call staff if our student numbers grow. This roster includes at least 1 executive teacher, 2 teachers, an LSA or Youth Worker most days, Rose and/or Laurie and then either Nathan or I.

Teachers are also following up with the families of students who are not completing work online or are failing to engage at all. We are offering many forms of support, including the provision of devices, free internet, hard copy packs of work, small group or family Google Meets and also the opportunity for these students to attend school, either full or part days so that they are able to access help at school. Aimee, our Family and Community Engagement Coordinator has contacted a number of our vulnerable students and their families to provide targeted support.

Assessment and Reporting

This time, with remote learning teachers are expected to assess and report on student learning with A-E reporting at the end of the year. Last time during remote learning teachers were able to provide a 'STATUS' grade for subject areas that they were not confident in reporting on due to lack of student learning evidence. This year teachers will be expected to report on all curriculum areas using A-E grades. If we are back at school next term, it will be easy to do this. However, if remote learning continues into term 4 there will be a layer of complexity that goes along with A-E reporting. It also adds a level of responsibility to students at home and also families to ensure that students complete tasks, including assessment tasks appropriately.

School Events

Unfortunately, it is unlikely that many of our whole school and community events will go ahead this year. This includes P & C events such as the Colour Fun Run, disco or the Preschool Fair. It is also unlikely that camps or inter school sports events will go ahead. We will wait on confirmation but we are not getting our hopes up at this stage. As a school we have learnt how to be creative in the virtual space and we will again look at ways to celebrate our students and our school in different but exciting ways.

School Climate and Satisfaction Survey Postponed

We have been informed that the school climate and satisfaction surveys have been postponed to term 4 due to lockdown. As a school we value the information this survey provides and look forward to collecting it next term to assist in informing us of future directions.
